Tolbert Health Care Quarterly Report

On September 7, 2005, the two Clinics carrying out the Tolbert Healthcare Project had their first quarterly meeting with the Claims Administrator, The West Anniston Medical Clinic Board of Directors and the Clinic Project Advisory Committee. Fulfilling the Project Mission Statement by providing Tolbert Claimants and their children high quality and inexpensive healthcare and prescription drugs, both Clinics have registered many Claimants as patients. Dr. Martin, who treats claimants born on or after July 1, 1985, has registered 700 Claimants with her Clinic, and 60 have been treated. Quality of Life, which treats the adult Claimants, has registered 2,500 Claimants as patients and has treated 400.

In addition to providing medical care to the Claimants, the two Clinics are providing large volumes of prescription drugs, filling approximately 350 Claimant prescriptions per day. Dental services will begin to be provided on October 1, 2005, and Claimants are encouraged to make a dental appointment now.

All Tolbert Claimants, whether they scored positive or not on their PCB test, are eligible to participate in the Tolbert Healthcare Project by using the Clinics. Quality of Life provides medical services to adults and Dr. Martin provides medical services to children. Prescription drugs may be ordered from either Clinic. Basic primary medical care, dental care, laboratory services and x-ray services are offered, and all services are free of charge except for small charges for some x-rays and some dental fillings and difficult tooth extractions.

If you qualify for the prescription assistance program (low income claimants) or if you use the Clinic doctor, available prescription drugs are free.

Use of the Clinics will not jeopardize your eligibility for Alabama Medicaid, Medicare or Social Security disability insurance.

The second \$2.5 million annual installment for Clinic operations was recently received from the Defendants, with the total operations endowment from the Defendants equaling \$25 million. The Plaintiffs' lawyers and the Claims Administrator are providing the Clinic with a \$750,000 endowment, paid in ten annual installments, a portion of which will be used to engage a Long Term Planner to help the Clinics obtain additional funding.

All Claimants are encouraged to use the Clinics, which may be the most important legacy of the Tolbert Settlement.
